

Walleye

Unfortunately no walleye restocking is in sight. The DNRE is only stocking lakes and rivers which have direct access to the Great Lakes. The virus is still existing within the walleye population and the DNRE is not stocking inland lakes such as Crystal. They did suggest we could obtain a permit to stock walleye ourselves at our own expense. Does this sound more like a money

problem with the State? Crystal has not been stocked with walleye since 2005.

Northern pike

Stunted growth in our northern pike? Many who fish regularly are catching only Northerns between 17 and 18 inches. I spoke to the DNRE Fish Biologist in Plainwell. He has sent me instructions and envelopes to collect scales off of these potentially

stunted Northerns. The scale samples twill determine the age of the Northern Pike. If indications are such that these pike are stunted, DNRE will lower the size limit so we can take them out of the lake. Volunteers are needed to help collect scales. Call Bonnie Kanitz, 989-283-9339 to obtain instructions and envelopes for DNRE sampling.

YEEHAW It's Roundup Time Again by Theron Guild

I attended a 4hour class put on by the DNR to apply for a permit to remove/destroy geese and or nests from Crystal Lake this year. Some counties, Montcalm being one of them, that have had a high number of geese removed in the past are required to

to obtain a permit at a cost of \$200, to be allowed to hire a licensed goose remover. The cost this year was \$350, a flat rate, rather than being based on the number of geese removed.

The round-up was June 17th and netted, pardon the pun, 38 geese. The roundup is conducted by many lake residents willing to help with this important community service each year.

Township Update by Bonnie Kanitz



Township Issues currently being worked are installing buoys at the public swim area, and Ordinance 15A.

Next working meeting with the Township Board on Ordinance 15A will be July 21 at 7 pm.

Status is the same as last

reported as meetings have been postponed from month to month. The real issue prompting a change to 15A was the proposed campground next to the Wet Spot. The Township Board grandfathered, under the current Ordinance 15A, twenty-five campground sites. The rationale being the owner had the hotel with 25 rooms prior in this location.

The other issue is the square footage required.

Current Ordinance 15A requires 12000 sq ft, and it has been suggested to lower this to 5000 sq ft with a 50 foot frontage. CLA currently agrees with this suggestion.

Our proposed language for a new Ordinance 15A will be based upon Cliff Bloom's article in the last Riparian Magazine, CLA recommends that the Township concur. The annual Fourth of July fireworks display is entirely funded by the dues paying members and other generous contributions to the "fireworks fund" of the CLA.
